COURSES TAUGHT

Norwegian language

I regularly teach beginning and intermediate Norwegian (semesters 1-4)

“Readings in Norwegian Literature”

This course is an overview of Norwegian texts from 1850-present taught in Norwegian. Students are at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Taught Fall 2021.

“Contemporary Scandinavian Languages”

This course introduces intermediate and advanced students of Scandinavian languages to key linguistic, literary, and cultural themes in Norwegian, Swedish, and Danish. I teach the Norwegian portion of this course with two colleagues. Taught multiple times.

“The Nordic Child”

This course examines the figure of the child in Nordic literature, film, and societies. Taught multiple times.

“Humans and Other Animals in Nordic Literature and Film”

This course introduces students to key questions in animal studies and posthumanism through Nordic film, texts, and cultures. Taught multiple times.

“Scandinavian Design”

This course uses the popular concept of “Scandinavian Design” to frame questions about Nordic texts and society. Taught multiple times.
